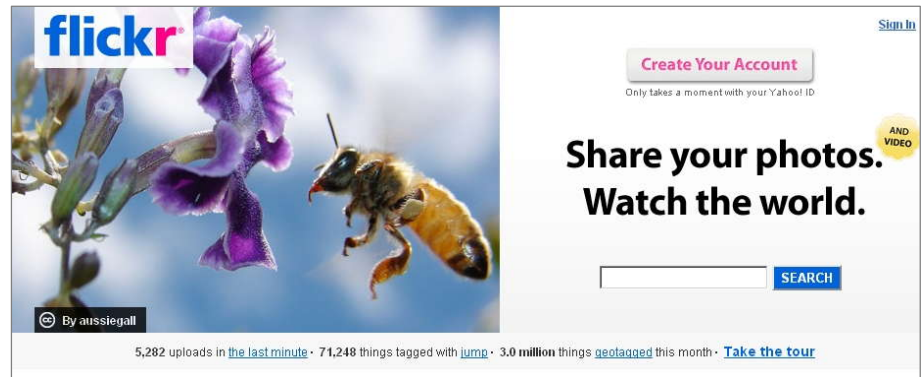


Flickr: Post, Organize & Share Photos Online

What is Flickr?

Flickr (www.flickr.com) is a powerful image hosting website where users can share, organize, and comment on photographs. It is free to set up an account and upload photos, although a “Pro” account may be purchased for about \$2 a month.



Signing Up for Flickr

Since Flickr is part of Yahoo, if you already have a Yahoo ID, you have all you need! If not, setting up a Yahoo ID is easy. On the main page of Flickr, click on the “Create Your Account.” Fill out the form, and you will soon be ready to post photos and do all the other fun stuff on Flickr.

Uploading Photos

To upload photos, click on “Upload Photos” on your home page. Click the link that says “Choose Photos” and a box will open that allows you to select files to add to Flickr. When you find the photos you want, double click on it to select it as the one you want to upload. Click the upload button. After you photos have finished uploading, you’ll also see a link that says “add a description”. Click on this link to start the next part of the process which is naming and tagging your photos.

Organizing, Tagging and Grouping Photos

Tagging is a way of assigning descriptive words to your photos so you (and others) can more easily find them. Tags can be anything you want them to be— the city the photo was taken in, objects or people in the photo, a special abbreviation for an event (BBQ2008), and so on.

Flickr still keeps the images though, so if you link to them somewhere else on the internet they’ll still be viewable there. Also, if you decide to upgrade your account, those images will all be there in your photostream to view again.
