C-SPAN2's *Book TV Bus* Coming to the Public Library on October 4 & 5

**Stops at Bond Hill Branch Library (Thursday,
October 4 at 2:00 – 4:00 p.m.) and Main Library
(Friday, October 5 at 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.)**



In early October, the Public Library of Cincinnati & Hamilton County is playing host to one of America's most identifiable nomadic vehicles – the Book TV Bus. The 45-foot long mobile studio that travels to local libraries, bookstores, and festivals to promote awareness of Book TV's unique non-fiction book programming, which airs every weekend on C-SPAN2, will be making stops at two Library locations: the Bond Hill Branch Library (at 1740 Langdon Farm Road at Jordan Crossing) on Thursday, October 4 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. and the Main Library (at 800 Vine Street) on Friday, October 5 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.



The Book TV Bus offers tours of its studio set, participation in an interactive demonstration about Book TV programming, the opportunity to learn how a television show is produced, a chance to sign up for programming alerts, and an opportunity to view clips from Book TV programs and featured authors. Since the Book TV Bus's launch in September of 2005, the Bus has made more than 400 stops at book festivals, libraries, colleges & universities, publishing houses, and bookstores. The Bus traveled over 76,000 miles to over 200 cities and thirty-nine states across the country. The crew has interviewed over 150 local authors and produced 20 video vignettes for air on Book TV.
