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Soup up your reading list with the 38th ATLA summer book sale

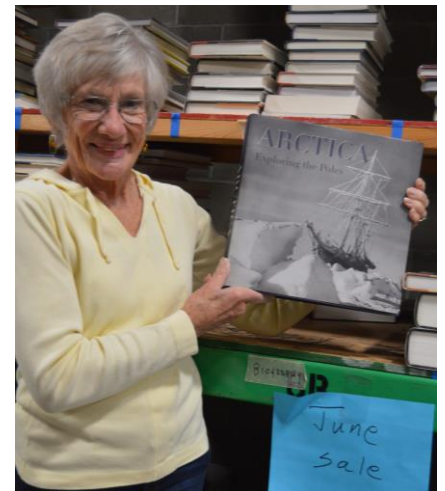
