New York Times bestselling author [Eric Litwin](#) comes to town in October to entertain fans of the *Pete the Cat* series. The song-singing, guitar-strumming author, who brings early literacy and music together, is giving four performances courtesy of the Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County.



There are two chances to catch his show Wednesday, Oct. 3, at the **Groesbeck Branch Library, 10:15 a.m.** and **11:15 a.m.**, and another two chances at the **Symmes Township Branch Library, 2:30 p.m.** and **3:30 p.m.**

The second shows at each branch are open to the public. No registration is required for them, but seating is limited.
